Shifting Perspective: Building Strengths and Resilience in Families • \$30

This workshop will explore how to mitigate and prevent Adverse Childhood Experiences through the use of the Strengthening Families Protective Factors Framework. Participants will learn the importance of resilience in families and how to build that through a strengths based approach. The Strengthening Families Protective Factors Framework gives communities a common language that is easily used with parents and kids. Participants will also discuss ways to build the Protective Factors Framework into their programs, services, and communities along with how to evaluate community progress. 3 CEUs are offered through CPCAN for this training. 3 SCECHs are available from the JCISD for \$15. 3.25 MCOLES approved.

Child Maltreatment in the Context of Caregiver Mental Illness • \$30

Child maltreatment often occurs in the setting of various risk factors which may occur in combination. A significant risk factor for child abuse may be a caregiver's mental illness and identifying mental illness in caregivers is crucial in intervention. The experiences of the University of Michigan Child Protection Team serve to highlight key points in assessing risk of child abuse and neglect in the setting of caregiver mental illness. 3 CEUs are offered through CPCAN for this training. 3 SCECHs are available from the JCISD for \$15. 3.25 MCOLES approved.

Abusive Head Trauma • \$25

This training will focus on the various forms of abusive head trauma and the mechanisms of these injuries. Injuries associated with abusive head trauma will be discussed. Participants will better understand the importance of history in determining whether a head injury resulted from physical abuse. Many head/brain injuries could result from an accident, neglect, or physical abuse with the history being most important in making the correct diagnosis. The speakers will focus on prevention of abusive head trauma; primary, secondary and tertiary prevention. Cases will be utilized in order to illustrate key points. 2 CEUs are offered through CPCAN for this training. 3 SCECHs are available from the JCISD for \$15. 2 MCOLES approved.
