Commission Resolution 2020-08 Resolution to Honor Commissioner Donald Mawer

WHEREAS, the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards is the duly appointed body of state government authorized to oversee and set standards for the basic training, in-service training, and licensure of Michigan law enforcement officers; and,

WHEREAS, Chief Donald Mawer was a dedicated Commissioner with the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and with his service he ensured the Commission continues to be a nationally recognized leader in the development of training and ethical standards for law enforcement officers; and,

WHEREAS, Chief Donald Mawer began his career in criminal justice by earning his bachelor's degree in Law Enforcement and his master's degree in Police Administration.

WHEREAS, Chief Donald Mawer continued in law enforcement being employed by the Marshall Police Department from 1990 until 2002 and then continuing service as the Chief of Police with the Frankenmuth Police Department beginning in 2003 through the present time.

WHEREAS, Chief Donald Mawer was appointed by Governor Rick Snyder in 2012 as a Commissioner for the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standard where he faithfully and ably served until 2020; and

WHEREAS, Chief Donald Mawer served on the Armed Reserve Committee where his years of experience and knowledge played an essential role in creating the first statewide standards for armed reserves and,

WHEREAS, Chief Donald Mawer has shown his commitment to excellence evidenced in his years of service to the law enforcement community in which he serves but also by his dedication to continuing to work to set standards for the profession ; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the members of the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards express profound appreciation and pay their highest tribute to the service of Chief Donald Mawer.
