YOUTH pays exhibitor fee & office fee \$19.00. No per head fee.

If youth enters open classes the \$10 open fee and \$8.00 per head fee must also be paid.

#### Rules and Regulations Governing the Open & Youth Show

**Exhibitors name must match the name on registration papers.**

Exhibitor must be 9 years of age but not over 20 years of age as of January

1 of current year to participate in any youth animal class. For classes

under the Youth Educational or Demonstration categories where premiums

apply, exhibitors are limited to youth who are 6 years of age but not over 19

years of age as of January 1 of current year. Date of birth must be on

entry form.

Open Exhibitor must be 9 years of age unless otherwise stated.

1. Both Exhibitor Entry, and Current W-9 (or W-8 Canadian) must be filled

out and returned with entry fees.

**Include for each animal a copy of registration papers.**

2. Open exhibitors must complete Open section of entry blanks and submit

all Open fees with the entry blank.

3. Youth exhibitors must complete Youth section of entry blank and submit

all Youth fees. Youth exhibitors entering Open classes must complete Open

section and pay \$10 open fee and \$8.00 per head fee.

4. Copies of Certificates of registration must be furnished and identity of each animal established, or the animal will be barred from competition. The superintendent will not allow the showing of any animal without a registration certificate. The exhibitor must be the owner of the animal. Animals owned in partnership or by syndicate may be entered in the name of the partnership or syndicate only.
5. All cattle entered for competition shall be presented in the judging ring in their natural conformation and with no preparation other than natural feeding and fitting with the exception of any treatment of hair, hoofs and horns.
6. Every exhibitor, in consideration of his entry being accepted, specifically represents that no animal entered by him has been or will be before entering the judging ring unethically fitted and he agrees to submit any animal for inspection at any time required before any inspector or inspectors appointed by the management, and he further agrees that the opinion of such inspector or inspectors shall be final and conclusive and without recourse against the management or any officer thereof or any person or persons appointed as inspector. Infringement of the above rules will be dealt with the same as any other fraud consummated or attempted.
7. All cows three years old or over entered in the several classes of breeding stock shall have born a calf within eighteen months prior to the exhibition or show satisfactory evidence of being in calf, or the cow cannot compete. Affidavits relating to cows regarding breeding may be required and evidence of this fact satisfactory to the superintendent shall be furnished by the exhibitor if required.
8. The superintendent may require that all cows and heifers in milk be milked out not earlier than 6:00 p.m., previous to showing and the superintendent or judge may require any animal to be milked out in the show ring.
9. An exhibitor may not receive more than one award in group classes, except in the get-of-sire and junior get-of-sire groups, where an exhibitor may receive two if the groups are sired by different sires and the sires are named. An exhibitor may show a maximum of two head per individual class except in futurity classes. Only first prize winners are eligible for Champion prizes, but second prize animals may compete for Reserve Championships. This does not apply to Production classes.
10. Only animals shown in single classes may show in group classes.
11. Milking machines or compressors must be shielded.
12. Stock tanks are prohibited from being used to water livestock.
13. Youth exhibitors in this department will be permitted to enter a maximum of seven head in the Youth division.
14. If you have not received your premium money by Nov 1 current year contact the entry office, as the fair will honor NO claims after Dec 1.

Dairy show will run according to the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association Show Ring Code of Ethics.

#### EXPLANATION OF TERMS

1. Exhibitor and Breeder—Where a herd is registered in the name of different members of a family, residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor for Premier Exhibitor, Premier Breeder, Breeder's Herd and Best Three Females.
2. Senior Champions and Reserve are chosen from first and second place animals two years old or over, or that has freshened.
3. Junior Champions and Reserve are chosen from first and second place animals under two years, females not to have freshened.
4. Breeder's Herd of Five Females, all owned by exhibitor—Group to consist of two females over two years of age, two females under two years of age and one any age. Three must be bred by exhibitor.
5. Best Three Females—Two must be senior females and the third any age, all bred by exhibitor and at least one to be owned by exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.
6. Best Three Junior Females—All must be junior females, all bred by exhibitor and at least one owned by exhibitor. One entry per exhibitor.
7. Produce-of-Dam—Group to consist of two animals, shown in an individual class, either sex, the produce of one cow. The dam must be named. Each exhibitor is limited to one group entry from the same dam. Animals need not both be owned by the exhibitor.
8. Premier Exhibitor's Award—The exhibitor winning the most points, not to exceed six animals owned and exhibited by himself in the open single classes shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. No more than two can be bulls. The scale of points will be the same as that for determining Premier Breeder.
9. Premier Michigan Breeder's Award—The breeder winning the most points, not to exceed six animals in the open single classes exhibited by himself and/or other exhibitors shall be designated the Premier Breeder. No more than two can be bulls. The point system for determining Premier Breeder is as follows:

10. Premier Breeder & Exhibitor to be awarded only if there are 5 or more animals exhibited at the fair in the breed.

**PRODUCTION PREMIUMS**

- An additional premium of \$50.00 will be paid to the top-producing cow in each milking age class no matter where she places. Copies of DHIA form 20 for an individual cow, which shows her completed record must be presented to the Superintendent to be eligible. The top-producing cow in each milking class will be recognized in the show ring after the judge has placed the class.
- The top-producing cow will be determined as follows:
  - a. Last actual record, 4% fat corrected, with the exception of two-year-old classes and Junior three-year-old class.
- To be eligible for premium, the production must be at least equal to breed average for the age group.

**Milk House**

**MILK PRODUCTION AND HANDLING**

- The production and handling of milk produced at the Michigan Exposition and Fairgrounds during the course of the fair shall meet all requirements of Federal, State and Municipal regulations.
- Samples will be checked daily for the presence of antibiotics. Any exhibitor supplying milk in which antibiotics are found will be barred from selling milk the remaining days of the fair and will be held financially responsible for any milk that may be contaminated,
- Milk will be received on non-show days between the hours of 6 a.m. to 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. On show days the milk house will be open from 6 am. to 7 p.m.
- Milk collected at the fair will be sold and the money returned to exhibitors based on their contributions.

1. A Bull Calf is born after August 31, 2008.
2. A Yearling Bull is born after August 31, 2006 and before September 1, 2008.
3. A Junior Heifer Calf is born after February 28, 2009, and is over four months of age.
4. An Intermediate Heifer Calf is born after November 30, 2008 and before March 1, 2009.
5. A Senior Heifer Calf is born after August 31, 2008 and before December 1, 2008.
6. A Summer Yearling Heifer is born after May 31, 2008 and before September 1, 2008.
7. A Junior Yearling or Spring Yearling Heifer is born after February 28, 2008 and before June 1, 2008.
8. An Intermediate Yearling or Winter Yearling Heifer is born after November 30, 2007 and before March 1, 2008.
9. A Senior Yearling or Fall Yearling Heifer is born after August 31, 2007 and before December 1, 2006.
10. A Jersey Senior Yearling in milk is born after August 31, 2006 and before December 1, 2007.
11. A Junior Two-Year-Old Cow is born after February 28, 2007 and before September 1, 2007.
12. A Senior Two-Year-Old Cow is born after August 31, 2006 and before March 1, 2007.
13. A Junior Three-Year-Old Cow is born after February 28, 2006 and before September 1, 2006.
14. A Senior Three-Year-Old Cow is born after August 31, 2005 and before March 1, 2006.
15. A Three-Year-Old Cow is born after August 31, 2005 and before September 1, 2006.
16. A Four-Year-Old Cow is born after August 31, 2004 and before September 1, 2005.
17. A Five-Year-Old Cow is born after August 31, 2003 and before September 1, 2004.
18. An Aged Cow is six years old and over, born before September 1, 2003.

It is not necessary that the present owner be a Michigan resident. No entry will be considered valid unless a copy of the registration papers accompany the entry form.

1. There will be no entry fee in Michigan Bred Classes.
2. Each Michigan Bred entry must be entered in one or more breed classes.
3. Enter Michigan Bred classes on your entry form.
4. Each exhibitor is allowed 2 entries per class.
5. Only the first 2 highest placed Michigan bred animals from each qualifying class will participate in the Michigan Bred Classes
