

CARE AND PROTECTION – FOR SHELTER-HOUSED ANIMALS (CRUELTY) PROJECT FORM

Applicant:

To provide support for the costs of the care, housing, and veterinary medical care as applicable for shelter animals that are housed for violations of Chapter IX, Public Act 328 of 1931; MCL 750.49-MCL 750.70, where sentencing does not provide for all or part of the applicable costs. (Public Act 328 of 1931, MCL 750.(8) –Cost of care & housing as part of sentencing.”

Michigan Penal Code, Act 328 of 1931, Chapter IX Animals, Section 50 provides that an owner, possessor, or person having the charge or custody of an animal must provide an animal with adequate care. “Animal” means any vertebrate other than a human and “adequate care” means the provision of sufficient food, water, shelter, sanitary conditions, exercise, and veterinary medical attention in order to maintain an animal in a state of good health. “State of good health” means freedom from disease and illness, and in a condition of proper body weight and temperature for the age and species of the animal, unless the animal is undergoing appropriate treatment.
