<u>WELCOME, APPROVAL OF PAST MEETING MINUTES AND ADDITIONAL AGENDA</u> ITEMS

Laura Campbell started the meeting at 1:06 p.m. No additional agenda items.

AROUND THE HORN

Everyone around the room shared their recent activities and events from their organization.

SYSTEM COMMITTEE REPORTS

LIVESTOCK

Josh Appleby reported that the committees have all met and discussed changes.

Livestock group met last week, and the Standards are moving along well.

Erica Rogers reported that there will be a few wording changes to include animal mortalities in the Livestock*A*Syst and Farm*A*Syst.

Additional changes will include a few set back distances to be consistent with the other tools and Livestock Standard question 13.02 static pile language will be updated. Discussion on MSUE moving forward on the certified applicator system. MSUE will handle the education portion of the program, Michigan Farm Bureau has been approached and is evaluating acting as the certifying agent for the program.

CROPPING

Josh Appleby reported that there are no changes to these Standards.

FARMSTEAD

Josh Appleby reported that the group has discussed chemigation valves and is looking for an interlock solution, similar to those used on irrigation wells. The group is waiting on DEQ approval. Josh reported that discussion also included truck bay washing guidelines for on the farms. Laura Doud reported that the Farm*A*Syst will have one change regarding fuel: greater than or equal header in the fuel section, and one additional question regarding BODA, for consistency with the Livestock*A*Syst.

FOREST, WETLANDS AND HABITAT

Jason Darling reported that the FWH Sub-committee will have a significant restructure of the tool, adding questions and language to existing questions, and focusing on the tables regarding each law.

COMMUNICATIONS WORKGROUP

Meredith Smith reported to the group that they have developed a MAEAP coloring book, featuring Wade Water Drop. MDARD will be ordering 10,000 copies.

The new MAEAP mascot Wade will be making his debut at the MAEAP 5,000 Event. 150 RSVP's have come in so far for the event.

Have a new host for the website, target date is March 20th continuing the work with Water Words that Work on wording, format and design of the new site.

Meredith and Emily Reinart asked the group for input on give-a-way ideas at the event.
