This notice is being provided to you pursuant to the Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act, 29 U.S.C. § 2101 ("WARN").

Please be advised that Quality Spring/Togo, Inc., located at 355 Jay Street, Coldwater, Michigan 49036, will be laying off employees on an indefinite basis lasting at least six (6) months. Please note that at this time, Quality Spring/Togo does not intend to close entirely.

Currently, twenty-eight (28) employees are on indefinite layoff. Although a few of those employees are expected to be recalled, the majority will remain on indefinite layoff for at least six (6) months. Furthermore, approximately thirty-five (35) production employees and eight (8) office employees will also be laid off for at least six (6) months. Importantly, although the Company would have preferred to provide employees with sixty (60) days advance notice as required by the WARN Act, it has just become clear that these layoffs must occur. Moreover, although the Company is not able at this time to specifically identify any additional layoffs, it is possible that additional employees may also be laid off on a permanent and/or long-term basis.

Quality Spring Togo regrets that these long-term layoffs must occur. However, the unpredictable, severe and significant decline in the automotive industry has caused an unexpected and unforeseen reduction in business. Under the WARN Act, the sixty (60) day notice period may be shortened due to such unforeseen business circumstances.


