This table identifies participants that all local WIC agencies must identify as at nutritional high risk if the condition is current. Risk codes followed by the plus (+) sign are state-designated nutritional high risk codes.

Participants receiving a Class III formula(s) must also be identified at nutritional high risk. This is the only nutritional high risk case not identified by a risk code.
