

Emergency Response to Nuclear Events

If a significant amount of radiation is released, a state emergency-response plan that includes state and local agencies will be activated. The Michigan State Police Emergency Management Division is the lead agency that has developed and participated in drills to test and implement radiological emergency-response plans. Local and state agencies have the experience and training required to respond to a wide variety of nuclear events.
