Goals

Decrease untimed and alcohol exposed pregnancies by increasing the use of effective contraception.

Reduce the use of alcohol among at risk women within CARE's service delivery system.

Relationship to Existing Programs

Project CHOICES, an evidenced-based approach, is integrated into CARE's services. Women of childbearing years receiving CARE's services, including case management and substance abuse assessments are eligible to receive a voluntary screen for Project CHOICES enrollment.

Additionally, women of childbearing years accessing services in the local community, including community health programs, WIC and Family Planning can be referred to CARE.
