

FASD Award Announcement

The Michigan Department of Community Health announces 10 community planning grant awards for Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders (FASD). The FASD community planning grant award projects are located throughout rural and urban areas in Michigan and are effective May 1, 2009. The awards serve to strengthen the development of an effective system of services for FASD prevention and intervention in Michigan.

Planning grant recipients will convene their community partners to complete a needs assessment, a strategic plan for service delivery that is guided by evidence-based protocol, to explore proposed implementation and evaluation strategies for 2009-2011. Services may include FASD prevention through alcohol screening & brief motivational intervention, screening of alcohol exposed children & adults, referral and follow-up with adoption, foster care, early education and juvenile court systems, and also include group training sessions for professionals and caregivers.
