Influenza is serious. There are many “faces” of influenza.

In fact, annual influenza vaccination is recommended for more than 2 out of every 3 people.¹

Influenza vaccine is safe and effective. Immunization is particularly important for people with chronic medical conditions, such as asthma and diabetes.
