



HIV Among Young Black Men who have Sex with Men (YBMSM), Michigan



Number of Cases and Recent Trends:

- Nationally and in Michigan, the fastest growing population of HIV-positive persons are young black males (ages 13-24) who have sex with males (MSM).
- Sixty-eight percent of black male HIV-infected individuals, between the ages of 13 and 19, had infections attributed to having sex with men (MSM).
- Nationally, HIV diagnoses among black MSM ages 13-24 increased by 48 percent between 2006 and 2010


Demographics:

- Between 2006 and 2010, MSM were 48 percent of all new HIV diagnoses. Of these, 55 percent were black.
- MSM between the ages of 13 and 19 are more likely to be black than those 20 years and older.

Other Facts:

- Data from the Young MSM Study of 2008 MSM2 cycle of NHBS revealed that the majority (81%) of 13 to 17 year old MSM engaged in anal sex at their most recent sexual encounter.
- The study also revealed that among those who had anal sex, about two-thirds (69%) used a condom the whole time compared to 5 percent part of the time and 26 percent not using a condom at all.

Program Efforts:

- Three of the 16 funded MDCH highly-targeted HIV prevention community based organization's primary target group is young black MSM.
- These organizations provide them with HIV counseling, testing, and deliver HIV specific evidence-based interventions.
