

## **Administrative Reports**

The Administrative Report provides usage statistics by individual disease or disease group for a selected time period in the applicable geographic area.

These statistics can aid local health departments in determining the speed with which their staff is completing investigations and they can also reveal any hangups with specific phases of the process.

The report provides the total number cases reviewed and the Average, Median and Maximum for each of the following:

- 1. Days from Onset to Referral
- 2. Days from Referral to Entry
- 3. Days from Referral to Completion
- 4. Days from Onset to Completion

Only administrators can produce these statistics in the MDSS. In order to do so, go to the System Administration screen by clicking on that link along the top navigation bar then click on the Administrative Reports link along the left navigation bar (see the picture below).

Just like the other reports the user will need to provide the desired timeframe for the report and the condition or disease group for which the report is to be run. LHD users will only be able to run reports on their own county, however if you would like to have some comparison your regional epidemiologist can run statewide or regional reports if requested.



Also like the other reports, the user needs to select the type of output of the report. Below is an example of the CSV report output for the Administrative Statistics run on all Foodborne Diseases reported to "A Fine County" between 10/01/2008 and 12/31/2008.
