Subject: Additional Codes Payable to Family Planning Clinics

Effective: February 1, 2011

Programs Affected: Medicaid, Plan First!

Effective for dates of service on and after February 1, 2011, family planning clinics can bill the following 11 Current Procedural Terminology (CPT) codes as identified in Table 1. In order to bill for these codes, family planning clinics must have the appropriate Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) certification.


