Subject: Estate Recovery for Supplemental Security Income Related Medicaid Programs

Effective: May 1, 2012

Programs Affected: Supplemental Security Income related Medicaid programs

Policy has been developed by the Third Party Liability section regarding the criteria for recovering monies from the estates of Medicaid recipients. Estate Recovery is a federal requirement for all recipients who meet the criteria outlined below. This policy also establishes criteria for exemption from Estate Recovery.

Criteria for recovery:

- Recipients were 55 years of age or older when they receive services covered by Michigan Medicaid (excluding Medicaid cost sharing); and
- Recovery from estate is cost effective; and
- There is no surviving spouse, no surviving disabled adult child, or a dependent child turns 21 years of age.

Criteria for exemption:

Undue hardship

Definitions of terms used for Estate Recovery:

Undue Hardship is when the estate is the sole income producing asset of the survivors, is a home of modest value, or recovery would cause the survivor to become or remain eligible for Medicaid.

A home of modest value is when a home is valued at 50% or less of the average price of homes in the county where the home is located.

Resources are all income and assets of a person.

A **survivor** is an heir who does not predecease the deceased beneficiary.

Under this policy there are criteria for referring divestments by a beneficiary to the Attorney General's office for legal action.

Manual Maintenance
