  - Subject: Social Security Number Exemption
  - Effective: October 1, 2013
- Programs Affected: Medicaid, Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)/MIChild

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has issued a clarification regarding the exemption of certain individuals from providing proof of a Social Security Number, or proof of application for a Social Security Number when applying for medical services. A *Conditional Entrant* to the United States is considered a qualified alien who has obtained satisfactory immigration status but *is not eligible* for a Social Security Card. The Medicaid eligibility final rule issued by CMS on March 23, 2012, specifies that an individual is exempted from providing a Social Security Number if that individual is not eligible for a Social Security Number or does not have one and is only eligible to receive a Social Security Number for a non-work purpose.

The following statement will be added to the Department of Human Services (DHS) Bridges Eligibility Manual (BEM) 223 pg. 9 and to the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) MIChild Eligibility Manual 3.4:

Any individual is exempted from providing a Social Security number if that individual is not eligible for a Social Security Number or does not have one and is only eligible to receive a Social Security Number for a non-work purpose such as an individual who is a Conditional Entrant to the United States.
