Interventions By Risk Level**

1. Write name of beneficiary on line provided
2. For each domain identified as a risk by the computer generated score sheet, you **MUST** use the specific Plan of Care Part 2, Interventions by Risk Level form for that domain.
3. The individual Plan of Care Part 2, Interventions by Risk Level forms **MUST** accompany the Plan of Care Part 1 and the Plan of Care Part 3, Signature Sheet for Interventions by Risk Level to comprise a complete POC document. After completion of the Risk identifier, POC 1, 2 and 3 **MUST** be in place before a subsequent visit may occur—unless there is a documented emergency. The POC 1, 2, 3 must also be completed before an agency may bill for completion of the risk identifier.

<i>Intervention level based on either the score sheet generated by the risk identifier or by professional judgment</i>	<i>If a Plan of care is “pulled” the beneficiary condition must match the criteria in this column</i>	<i>This column houses the standardized interventions. You are not required to do all interventions for a domain. The interventions that are completed are based on an individual beneficiary’s needs.</i>
<p>This column is populated with the score for each domain (low, moderate, high) that is generated by the algorithm for the <i>Maternal Risk Identifier</i> (MRI) or the <i>Infant Risk Identifier</i> (IRI)</p> <p>It is the level of care coordination, service intensity that can be anticipated based on the beneficiary’s responses to specific questions on the <i>Risk Identifier</i>.</p> <p>There is also an Emergency score. It is not computer generated and is based on professional observation and judgment</p> <p>If the risk level scores out on the computer generated score sheet, then you are not required to put a date in the “Date: _____” line</p> <p>If you add a domain—or change the level of risk, then you must put a date on the “Date: _____” line</p> <p>You are not prohibited from adding a date when the risk level is generated by the score sheet. Some MIHP agencies have requested that as an option.</p>	<p>This column has descriptions of the risks that are anticipated at each intervention level. Some of the risks are identified on the <i>Maternal Risk Identifier</i> or <i>Infant Risk Identifier</i>. Others are based on observation or additional beneficiary interview.</p> <p>Risks in the risk information column that are based on professional observation or additional beneficiary interview are marked on the POC with a checkbox.</p> <p>Risk information that comes directly from the MRI or IRI does not have a box in front of it</p>	<p>This column houses the standardized interventions. Interventions are minimum expectations of service delivery and are developed based on best practices and available evidence. They are stratified by service intensity level. General guidelines for each of the service delivery levels are as follows:</p> <p><u>Emergency risk</u>: Take immediate action. Call 911. Inform MHP and medical care provider immediately. Monitor closely, as need for emergency services may be episodic.</p>
