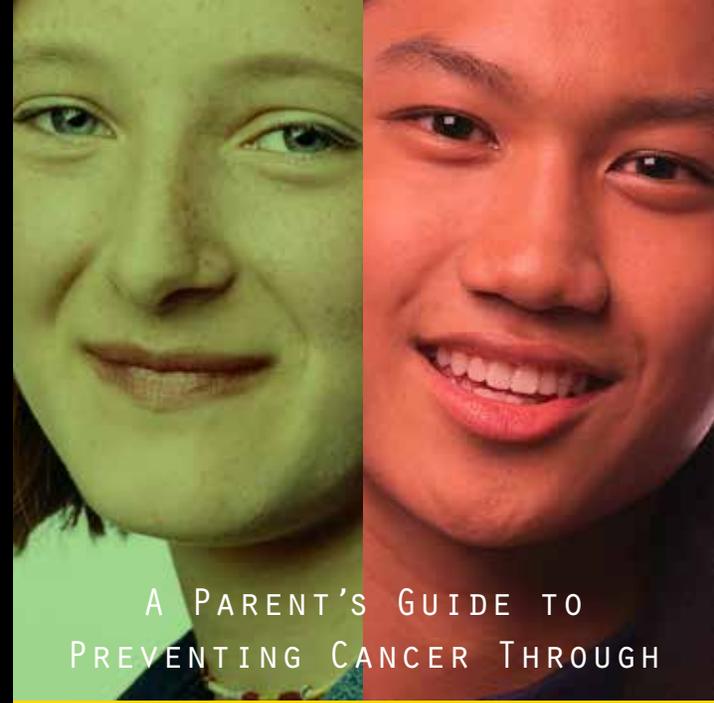



HPV VACCINATION




What if you could protect your child from getting
