TOT Learning Objectives:

1. Acquisition of current, research-based FASD information

3. Skills to plan, provide, evaluate FASD education

TOT Requirements:

1. Full participation at five-day training
2. Completion of pre- and post-evaluations
3. One written assignment and one oral report
4. Provision and evaluation of at least two FASD-related trainings within one-year of completing the TOT training

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Fetal alcohol spectrum disorders (FASD) is the umbrella term used to describe the range of lifelong effects that can occur due to prenatal alcohol exposure including physical, cognitive, behavioral, and/or social deficits. Many health and human services providers, educators, and others work with clients affected by prenatal alcohol exposure, but may lack training to effectively identify, refer, and/or provide appropriate services.

The TOT Certificate Program provides up-to-date, science-based information on FASDs; promotes skills and strategies to provide effective FASD education to a range of health and human services providers, families, consumers, and others; and shares awareness and education materials. It utilizes the "FASD Competency-Based Curriculum Development Guide for Medical and Allied Health Education and Practices" developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and others.
