

Note: In each of the above categories, those clients who entered treatment with a status that was already positive (zero use at admission, employed, and/or not homeless) are excluded. For those persons:
 86.3% of those who reported no use at their first service, maintained their abstinence on their last date of service.
 76.6% of those employed at their first service, kept their employed status on their last date of service.
 98.2% of those in a stable living situation at their first service, remained in one on their last date of service.
