Of the 822,000 'In Need', it is estimated that only 260,000 made an effort to get treatment at some time in the past year. Many of these persons were able to receive treatment in programs not funded by BSAAS.

Major reasons reported for not making an effort to get treatment are: 1) not ready to stop using, 2) no health insurance and could not afford cost, 3) might have a negative impact on job, and 4) did not know where to go for treatment.

Approximately 1 out of 11 persons with a substance use disorder received treatment services from state-funded programs.
