

Michigan Developmental Disabilities Council

Purpose:

To improve the lives of people with developmental disabilities in Michigan by:

- Carrying out and evaluating the grants included in the Council's Five-Year Strategic Plan;
- Ensuring that grant projects are developed in accordance with the Council's intent, as described in the Strategic Plan;
- Reviewing performance of active grant projects.

What we do:

- Help and oversee staff's work in developing strategies to carry out grant-related parts of the Plan by reviewing and approving RFPs, and the documents that put the Council's grants out for bid.
- Ensure that RFPs will bring in proposals for projects that will carry out the Council's intent and achieve its purpose.
- Oversees active grant projects by reviewing reports from Council staff and the projects, in order to:

°Asses the projects' progress and ensure that they stay on task to produce intended outcomes

°Help Council staff and grantees to solve complex implementation problems; and

°Support the staff's work with projects.

 Reviews and makes recommendations to Council's Executive Committee and full Council about procedures to award grants

Objectives:

- Provides the Council with tools for promoting systems change and supports the hopes and dreams of people with disabilities
- Issues grants only in accordance to the Council's Plan.
- Issues more that \$1 million worth of grants each year, "To support people with developmental disabilities to achieve life dreams"
- Watches grant projects to ensure that they are doing what they set out to do and running according to Council's intent.
- Requires that all projects:

^oLead to changes in the system that serve them.

° Add to the resources available to support people with developmental disabilities.

°Do these in ways that continue long after the grant project is over.

Are evaluated for:

°Carrying out the council intent

°Make their findings and other products widely available
