Michigan Civil Rights Commission to Meet Monday, October 6 in Pontiac

Lansing - The Michigan Civil Rights Commission will host a regular public meeting from 6 to 8 pm on Monday, October 6, at the Oakland Livingston Human Services Agency, 196 Cesar E. Chavez Avenue, Pontiac, 48343.

The agenda includes a presentation on civil rights curriculum development by James Cameron, Social Studies Consultant to the Michigan Department of Education, and presentations from the Detroit Branch NAACP and the North Oakland Chapter NAACP.

Individuals who wish to address the Commission on civil rights issues will have an opportunity to speak during the public comment period at the end of the meeting.

The Michigan Civil Rights Commission was created by the Michigan Constitution to carry out constitutional and legal guarantees against discrimination. The Commission is charged with investigating alleged discrimination against any person because of religion, race, color or national origin, sex, age, marital status, height, weight, arrest record, and physical and mental disability.
