NOTE: Paper/Pencil test dates for the M-STEP ELA, mathematics, science, and social studies assessments will occur on designated dates within the testing windows.

What is the MME? MME = Michigan Merit Examination The MME consists of 3 **required** components: • SAT with Essay: Provides the ELA and Mathematics scores for Accountability (paper/pencil only) Required by Michigan law (paper/pencil only) • ACT WorkKeys: O M-STEP: Provides Science and Social Studies scores for Accountability (online or paper/pencil)





MME Eligibility – 11th graders

All students are expected to take the entire MME as 11th graders.

- Required:
 - All first-time 11th graders
 - All 11th grade foreign exchange students
- Eligible but not required:
 - Repeating 11th grader missing a valid score in one or more of the three MME components – must take entire MME

• Not eligible:

 Repeating 11th graders with valid scores in all three of the MME components



→ OVERVIEW

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is pleased to continue the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress (M-STEP), along with the Michigan Merit Exam (MME), PSAT Assessments, MI-Access alternate assessments, WIDA, and Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments.

The MDE saw continued successes during the 2017-2018 school year. These successes included:

- over 99% of schools administered assessments online
- on average, a total testing time of 3 hours or less for mathematics and English language arts combined
- preliminary reports available in less than 48 hours after a student completed an online test
- final M-STEP reports provided to schools before Labor Day

For the 2018-2019 school year, MDE is offering grants to assist in the purchase of benchmark assessments in grades K-8. In addition, PSAT 8/9 will replace the 8th grade M-STEP mathematics and English language arts (ELA) assessments as the required assessment in grade 8.

The new M-STEP science assessments will be field tested again in 2019 as we continue to develop new science assessments aligned to Michigan's current science content standards.

Additional information on each state assessment is provided within this document. Michigan's assessment system will continue to set national standards for quality and rigor, while measuring how well our students are doing in preparing for careers and college. We look forward to working together to build on our successes and having another great assessment year.



Early Literacy and Mathematics Benchmark Assessments (K-2) Supports and Accommodations Table and Resources

Revised August 8, 2018



This document contains state-allowed universal tools, supports, and accommodations for the Early Literacy & Mathematics Benchmark Assessments (K-2). It additionally includes guidance on providing certain supports and accommodations to students such as scribes or translators. Please be sure that all staff involved in the planning and administration of the assessments reviews this document completely.

Michigan's Conceptual Model for Assessment Supports

Michigan meets the legislative requirements of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) by offering a wide array of supports and accommodations for students across all of its assessments. The conceptual model for understanding Michigan's assessment supports and accommodations is now broken down into three levels:

- Universal Tools Available for all students
- Designated Supports Available when indigated by an adult or team
- Accommodations Available need is documented in an IEP or 504 plan

This model portrays the additive and sequentially inclusive nature of these three aspects. Universal Tools are available to all students, including those receiving Designated Supports and those receiving Accommodations. Designated Supports are available only to students who an adult or team has indicated has need for these accommodations; these supports are available as well for students for whom the need is documented. Accommodations are available only to those students who have documentation of the need through a formal plan (i.e., IEP or 504). These students also may use designated supports and universal tools.

It's important to note that something designated as a "designated support" for one content area (for example, a calculator) may not be allowable for another content area. This approach is consistent with the emphasis that Michigan's assessment programs have placed on the validity of assessment results coupled with access. Allowable universal tools, designated supports, and accommodations all yield valid scores when used in a manner consistent with the guidelines in this document.

Standard Test Administration Practices

The list on the following page shows Michigan considered general Test Administration Practices for the K-2 Early Literacy & Mathematics assessments. Please note that special designation or reporting on the use of these practices is not required:

Testing Policy for Recently Arrived, First Year English-Learner Students Spring 2018 (Revised 1-2-18)

The Michigan Department of Education is able to provide certain exceptions to the state assessment policy for first year, English learner (EL) students. Students that are identified as Limited English Proficient (LEP) in the Michigan Student Data System (MSDS) and have been enrolled in U.S. schools (excluding Puerto Rico) for 12 months or less at the time of taking a state assessment may be eligible to receive a one-time exception from having to take the English language arts portion of state assessments. Specific exception information is provided below for each assessment.

Regardless of the length of time enrigiled in a U.S. school (excluding Puerto Rico), it is expected that each EL student was administered the WIDA ACCESS Placement Test (W-APT) or WIDA Screener and that the W-APT/WIDA Screener score has been provided in the Secure Site. It is also expected that each EL student be administered the summative WIDA ACCESS for ELLs if the student was enrolled prior to the most recent WIDA ACCESS for ELLS 2.0/WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs test administration period. The summative WIDA ACCESS for ELLS 2.0 or the WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLS should be administered annually while the student is LP eligible.

In order for a student to be eligible for an exception from the ELA portion of a state assessment, the student needs to have taken the WIDA ACCESS Placement Test (W-APT) with their scores provided in the Secure Site, and that the student has taken the most recent administration of the summative WIDA ACCESS for ELLs 2.0 or WIDA Alternate ACCESS for ELLs if enrolled prior to the test administration window.

Below is additional information on the ELA exception for ELs for each state assessment.

M-STEP Assessments

 Exceptions may be requested for the ELA content area only. Students meeting the exception criteria need to have issues submitted for each student requested AFTER the M-STEP test administration window, during the Verification of Not Tested window in the Secure Site.

MI-Access Assessments

- Exceptions may be requested for the "ELA Accessing Print" and "ELA Expressing Ideas" portions parts of the MI-Access Functional Independence assessment.
- Exceptions may also be requested for the MI-Access Participation and Supported Independence assessments in the Secure Site.
- Students meeting the exception criteria need to have issues submitted for each student requested AFTER the MI-Access test administration window, during the Verification of Not Tested window in the Secure Site.

SAT Assessments

· Ensure that students are listed on the Pre-Id Student Report. Then, request approval for providing math-only materials for eligible students through the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Online System. The SSD Online will approve math-only requests for first-year EL students as a state allowed accommodation. To submit a request, the SSD Coordinator should go to the State Allowed Accommodations Dashboard in the College Board SSD Online system and enter a new request. When submitting, choose EL-Math Only from the state allowed accommodations list. The accommodation will be automatically approved and students will test with a lime-colored test book. This will ensure the eligible EL exception students are tested with materials that will still yield their required valid math score. The SSD Coordinator will only use the scripts for the
