**SUBJECT:** 2020 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act Public Reporting of Data

The federal regulations implementing the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) at §300.602(b)(1)(i)(A) require public reporting on the performance of each local education agency on the targets established in the State Performance Plan/Annual Performance Report (SPP/APR) for each of the priority areas (Part B: Ages 3 through 21) in Michigan. Please review your district's data in advance of release of the SPP/APR in order to answer questions that may arise when released to the public.

The SPP/APR for Part B of the IDEA 2004 (ages 3 through 21) is comprised of results and compliance indicators. The 2020 public reporting data are from the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 school years. The Part B indicators predominantly reflect data your district submitted to the state. For Part B, the following indicators are being publicly reported:

- Indicator 1 - Graduation
- Indicator 2 - Dropout
- Indicator 3 - Statewide Assessment
- Indicator 4A - Suspension/Expulsion
- Indicator 4B - Suspension/Expulsion by Race/Ethnicity
- Indicator 5 - Educational Environments: Ages 6-21
- Indicator 6 - Early Childhood Educational Environments: Ages 3-5
- Indicator 7 - Preschool Outcomes
- Indicator 8 - Parent Involvement
- Indicator 9 - Disproportionate Representation (Child with a Disability)
- Indicator 10 - Disproportionate Representation (Eligibility Categories)
- Indicator 11 - Child Find

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Indicator 12 - Early Childhood Transition  
Indicator 13 - Secondary Transition  
Indicator 14 - Postsecondary Outcomes

For a two-week period beginning in early May, member districts, public school academies, and intermediate school districts will be able to preview data for children and students ages 3 through 21 before the required public reporting date of June 1. In a separate communication, you will be notified when the data are available to be previewed.

By June 1, 2020, the data will be available at the [MI School Data Portal](http://www.mischooldata.org) (www.mischooldata.org).
