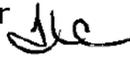

SUBJECT: Estimated Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Allocations for the IDEA, Part B, Section 611, Special Education Flowthrough Grant and General Supervision System Grant

For your planning purposes, the attached charts show your estimated allocations for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Part B, Section 611, Special Education Flowthrough grant and General Supervision System grant for Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-2021. Estimated allocations are based on preliminary information we received from the United States Department of Education (ED), audited Fall 2019 public school counts, and 2019-2020 non-public enrollment counts (please refer to the attached charts for calculation methodology).

You will receive a formal Grant Award Notification from the State Superintendent, pending receipt of the federal grant award from the ED and final approval. Please note that your estimated amount could change based on the final grant award received from the ED.

The application for the IDEA, Part B, Section 611, Special Education Flowthrough grant is available and ready for Intermediate School Districts (ISDs) to complete in the Michigan Electronic Grants System Plus (MEGS+). The due date of the Special Education Flowthrough grant is changing from its originally scheduled date of July 1, 2020 to **Friday, July 31, 2020**. This modification is a result of the delay in the Michigan Department of Education, Office of Special Education (MDE OSE) notifying ISDs of estimated allocations.

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In addition to the above change, the MDE OSE is adjusting the availability and due dates of the General Supervision grant application. The General Supervision System grant will be available on July 31, 2020 with a due date of **Friday, August 28, 2020**. This is due to the MDE OSE issuing annual determinations on the performance of each local special education program servicing students with individualized education programs (IEPs) in late June 2020 and the continuation of the 2019-2020 General Supervision grant final report preceding the 2020-2021 General Supervision grant application submission.

The following is important information regarding the FY 2020-2021 Flowthrough grant and General Supervision grant applications:

Flowthrough:

- The Flowthrough application is moving from a 27-month period to a 15-month period. Any unspent funds after the 15-month period will automatically carryover to the next grant application. The application will look similar other than the removal of the option to select "Year 1," "Year 2," or "Year 3," and the proportionate share requirement will be a drop selection similar to required and voluntary CEIS. The MDE OSE will receive feedback from ISDs on the functionality of the carryover moving to the next grant application and how the new grant application will display the carryover amounts. The FY 2018-2019 and FY 2019-2020 grant applications will remain 27-month grants. The above changes are due to the MDE transitioning to a new grants management system for FY2022 and limited ability to have customized applications in the new system.
- There continues to be a requirement to attach each ISD proportionate share calculation to the Flowthrough grant application in MEGS+. A proportionate share calculation example will be included under the Budget section in the application. Each ISD will attach its proportionate share calculation on the Attachments page of the application.
- The updated State Aid & IDEA Part B, Section 611 Allowable Costs document has been attached to the Flowthrough grant application in MEGS+.

General Supervision System:

- The purpose of the General Supervision System grant is to support ISD development and implementation of a General Supervision System that will, in part, support improvement efforts and build capacity within its local districts to fulfill the responsibilities under IDEA to ensure the provision of a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) for all students with an IEP.

General Supervision (continued):

- ISDs will complete the General Supervision System grant plan in Catamaran and submit its budget and staff special education credentials in MEGS+. The application in MEGS+ will be approved at 50 percent funding after an initial review of the budget and staff special education credentials. Upon the MDE OSE's acceptance of the General Supervision System grant plan in Catamaran, the MDE OSE will download the MDE Approved 2020-2021 General Supervision System Grant Application (Download) file from Catamaran and upload the file under the Program Information link in MEGS+ on behalf of the ISDs, and approve the applications at 100 percent.
- If the General Supervision System Grant budget includes any staff, please attach the credentials of all staff being paid from this grant. **Remove Social Security numbers** on any piece of documentation before attaching. All staff paid from this grant are required to possess a current Special Education credential recognized by the MDE. Each staff member credential should be attached on the Credentials page of the General Supervision System grant application in MEGS+.
