

Future Proud Michigan Educator Grow Your Own Programs Explore Micro-Grant

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is continuing the Future Proud Michigan Educator (Future PME) initiative with a new micro-grant opportunity. Schools who do not currently have a future teacher opportunity for K-12 students are invited to apply for \$2,500 Explore micro-grants. These grants will fund preparation and recruitment activities that will serve as an initial foundation for Grow Your Own (GYO) programming for students in the district.

Through <u>Future PME Explore</u>, students can build a deeper understanding of teaching and learning through collaboration with their peers, meaningful relationships with educators, and outreach to local colleges and universities. Designed for students in grades 6-12, Future PME Explore programming provides an expanded opportunity to interest young people in education careers and grow a diverse future teacher workforce.

EXPLORE GROW YOUR OWN GOALS

- 1. Promote positive messaging about local teachers and teaching opportunities
- 2. Increase the number of students interested in careers as local educators
- 3. Begin building GYO programming and infrastructure

GRANT TIMELINE

Applications due: March 18, 2022

Spending timeline: February 1, 2022 to August 30, 2022 Reimbursement for incurred expenses: September, 2022

GANT RESOURCES AND ACTIVITIES

Grantees will be awarded up to \$2,500 to support the activities listed below. These funds can be used in conjunction with other Explore program grants.

- Complete <u>professional learning</u> for potential Explore instructors
- Organize a student visit to a Michigan educator preparation provider
- Establish a future educators club (i.e. <u>Educators Rising</u>, <u>YES club</u>, <u>FCCLA</u>, etc.)
- Award a planning stipend to a teacher sponsor for the 2022-23 academic year
- Produce local media and marketing materials for a Future PME Explore program
- Host a <u>Decision Day</u> celebration for graduating students who plan to become educators
