What is an Early Middle College?

An early middle college (EMC) is a Michigan Department of Education (MDE) approved five-year program of study. The EMC is designed to allow a pupil to earn a high school diploma, college credit, and credentials.

What are the benefits to the postsecondary partners?

- Exposing high school students to college and earning college credits.
- ✓ College credits earned by Michigan EMC students in 2019-2020 totaled 185,536¹.
- Students are more likely to enroll in college after completing their fifth year of high school.
- ✓ 82% of Michigan 2020 EMC graduates earned 46+ college credits².




- ✓ Collaborate with EMCs to develop a strong career and college readiness curriculum.
- ✓ Develop a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the EMC and work in partnership to assist high school students in earning college credit and credentials.
- ✓ Attend planning meetings with the high school EMCs.
- ✓ Report student information as required in state data systems.

How do I become an EMC partner with EMCs?

Partner with schools within close proximity to the college and/or refer to the list of EMCs in <u>MI School Data</u> to discuss additional options for their students.
