Local Wellness Policy Triennial Assessment Waiver

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is pleased to announce that the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) released an additional nationwide waiver for the Local Wellness Policy Triennial Assessment. The intent of this waiver

is to support Local Education Agencies (LEAs) unable to complete a triennial assessment of the local school wellness policies by June 30, 2021, due to school closures as a result of the pandemic.

LEAs required to complete a triennial assessment by June 30, 2021, may now choose to accept the new regulatory deadline and instead complete their first assessment by June 30, 2022. These LEAs would complete a second triennial assessment by June 30, 2025.

LEAs wishing to accept this new deadline of June 30, 2022, must notify MDE, Office of Health and Nutrition Services, by **June 30, 2021**. Please complete the [Local Wellness Policy Triennial Assessment Waiver](#) survey to accept this waiver. Submission of this survey indicates approval of the assessment deadline extension to June 30, 2022.

Community Eligibility Provision School Year 2021-2022 Eligibility Notification

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) is required to notify National School Lunch Program sponsors of their potential eligibility to participate in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP). The following [spreadsheet](#) is based on spring 2021 data and its purpose is to help you determine if your school/district is eligible to participate in CEP this coming school year.

The spreadsheet includes:

- Schools/districts currently participating in CEP.
- Schools/districts eligible to participate in CEP (Identified Student Percentage >40%).
- Schools/districts near eligible to participate in CEP (Identified Student Percentage 30.00-39.99%).

Certified Spring 2021 site level data is at the [School Nutrition Programs CEP Website](#) and will be part of your 2022 CNP: School Nutrition Program Michigan Electronic Grants System Plus (MEGS+) Application.

The Nationwide Waiver of Community Eligibility Deadlines extended the deadline for electing CEP for the upcoming school year. You must notify the MDE School Nutrition Programs (SNP) unit of your intention to participate in the CEP for School

Year 2021-2022 by August 31, 2021, or the first day of school, whichever is earlier. SNP requires the notification to occur by selecting “yes” to question number 12 and saving the *Sponsor Information Page* in the 2022 CNP: School Nutrition Program MEGS+ Application. This selection must be made by the deadline, as a late selection cannot be approved.

The 2022 MEGS+ application will be available in July 2021.

Based on the CEPI spring data, my district or participating sites are at 100% free claiming. How do I apply/reapply with these data?

- CEPI spring data will load into the SNP 2022 MEGS+ application when it opens in July.
- If you are new to CEP, the page will load with the data.
- If you are reapplying, the data will load when the page is unlocked by MDE staff by request.
- Reapplying will start a new 4-year cycle.
- Nonpublic schools and early childhood buildings that are currently participating do not have CEPI spring data. Enrollment lists will need to be uploaded by following the process below.

Based on the CEPI spring data, my district or participating sites are not at 100% free claiming. How do I determine my end of year eligibility?

- Eligibility will be determined by MDE. To do this, you need to upload an Excel file with the full student enrollment from SY 20-21 into [GEMS/MARS](#) that contains the following information: School building code, school name, UIC, last name, first name, DOB, address, student number, F/R determination basis, application/household number, and McKinney Vento determinations.
- **Student data should not be emailed**, it needs to be uploaded using the secure [GEMS/MARS link](#). If you have an account, is recommended to log in when possible and not submit data as a guest.

How do non-public schools apply for CEP?

- Non-public schools do not report in the spring general collection, so they will need to upload an enrollment list.
- Eligibility will be determined by MDE. To do this, you need to upload an Excel file with the full student enrollment from SY 20-21 into [GEMS/MARS](#) that contains the following information: School building code, school name, UIC, last name, first name, DOB, address, student number, F/R determination basis, application/household number, and McKinney Vento determinations.
- **Student data should not be emailed**, it needs to be uploaded using the secure [GEMS/MARS link](#). If you have an account, is recommended to log in when possible and not submit data as a guest.

CEP Household Information Report for SY 21-22

The CEP Household Information Reports (HIR) for SY 21-22 have been updated and posted to the [CEP Forms & Instructions webpage](#). There are two versions available to use. One version of the form uses annual income ranges and the other uses household size and monthly income. For sponsors participating in the National School Lunch Program Seamless Summer Option (NSLP-SSO), we have developed a template letter that can be accompany the HIR.

Indirect Cost Calculations Template

The Office of Health and Nutrition Services (OHNS) Fiscal and Administrative Team (FAST) is pleased to release an updated Indirect Cost Calculations Guidance for School Food Authorities (SFA). Indirect Costs charged to the Non-profit Food Service Account (NFSA) are required to be calculated and charged with the approved methodology. This template may be used for calculating indirect costs; however, it is not mandatory that SFAs use this template. SFAs may use other avenues for charging indirect costs provided the calculations are done in accordance with the approved methodology and adequate supporting documentation is maintained on file.

An SFA does not have to take the maximum allowable amount for indirect costs. However, the SFA cannot exceed their maximum allowable amount. If the maximum allowable amount for indirect costs is exceeded, MDE must require that the SFA reimburse the NFSA for the amount in excess.

National School Lunch Program (NSLP) Meal Pattern Flexibility Waiver for School Year 2021-2022

In an effort to help with planning for School Year 2021-2022, MDE decided to divide the Meal Pattern Flexibility waiver requests into two parts. The form for Part 1 of the [Meal Pattern Flexibility Waiver Form for School Year 2021-2022](#) is now available. Use this form to request flexibilities in the National School Lunch Program (including SSO) for Target 2 sodium, 1% flavored milk, and/or 100% whole grain-rich for the 2021-2022 school year.

Reasons for allowing 1% flavored milk and serving less than all items as whole grain-rich will be required. Reasons should be targeted and justified with a demonstrated need based on plans to support access to nutritious meals while

minimizing potential exposure to COVID-19, or because of student acceptability. The form will be approved on a case-by-case basis for each sponsor.

A second form (Part 2) will be available later in the summer for additional options listed in [USDA Waiver #90](#).

Please keep your students' health and well-being in mind and seek to meet the meal pattern requirements to the greatest extent possible.

Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) Meal Pattern Flexibility Waiver for July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022

The Meal Pattern Flexibility [waiver request form](#) for CACFP is now available. Complete this form to request the following items:

- Waive the requirement to serve one whole grain rich item per day.
- Waive the requirement to begin using ounce equivalents to measure grain servings by October 1, 2021.
- Waive the requirement of only serving fat free flavored milk (allows 1% flavored milk for participants ages 6 and up).

CACFP Sponsors will need to provide targeted, justified reasons for their request(s). Reasons are to demonstrate specific need based on the Sponsor's plans to support access to nutritious meals while minimizing potential exposure to COVID-19. Requests will be approved on a case-by-case basis for each sponsor.

Please keep your participants' health and well-being in mind and seek to meet the meal pattern requirements to the greatest extent possible. All CACFP meal pattern requirements remain in effect unless a waiver is approved.

Frequently Asked Questions

Question: What do I do if my milk delivery is late and I have a meal distribution and I run out of milk?

Answer: Please complete the [Meal Pattern Flexibility Waiver Request \(SY20-21\)](#) to report the shortage of milk. Please include the date and the number of meals that were not complete (missing milk). When the request is approved, then you can still claim them as reimbursable meals.

Question: May SFAs operating SSO in SY 21-22 serve weekend and holiday meals through SSO?

Answer:

- **No**, consistent with supporting a transition back to more traditional school year operations, SFAs may not provide weekend or holiday meals through the **SSO** when school is in session during the regular school year.
- Weekend and holiday meals may be provided through CACFP At-Risk Afterschool Meal Program for SY 21-22

Question: What are my options to offer a snack program in SY 2021-2022?

Answer:

- If you are participating in the NSLP- Seamless Summer Option (SSO) for SY 21- 22 you can offer:
- NSLP- Afterschool Snack Program; or
- CACFP At-Risk Afterschool Snack/Supper Program

Nationwide area eligibility waiver in effect July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022.

Allows all schools and other afterschool sites, regardless of location, to claim afterschool snacks and meals at the free rate.
