

Administrative Rules Changes for Career Technical Education (CTE)

2019 Changes to Administrative Rules:

In accordance with newly revised law ([MCL 380.1233](#)), the issuance of [Substitute Career Authorizations \(SCA\)](#) is content specific and allows a non-certified or endorsed individual to serve as a substitute for an industrial technology education course or state-approved Career and Technical Education (CTE) course.

2018 Changes to Administrative Rules:

In accordance with newly revised law ([MCL 380.1233b](#)), the issuance of Annual Career Authorizations (formerly known as Annual CTE Authorizations) can be utilized for employing either of the following non-certified individuals:

- Individuals from business and industry to instruct in a state-approved Career and Technical Education (CTE) program;
- Individuals from business and industry to instruct in a 6-12 non-CTE industrial technology program (e.g. career pathway courses).

Additionally, holders of the CTE certificates can be utilized to staff non-CTE funded, general education courses in grades 6-12. See the [Quick Reference: Courses that can be Taught](#) document for additional information.

NOTE: Effective September 25, 2018, candidates seeking initial teacher certification through the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) are not be required to take a Basic Skills Exam (e.g. BST, SAT, PRE, ACT).
