Assessment Description: The Certiport IC3 Digital Literacy Certification exams comprise Computing Fundamentals, Key Applications, and Living Online for Global Standard 4 and Global Standard 5. No prior experience is recommended or required to attempt this certification.

Content Areas Covered by the Assessment:

IC3 Global Standard 4 (GS4) exam objectives are aligned with today's most current technologies and relevant digital literacy requirements, including social media, collaboration, and cloud computing concepts. The GS4 certification is comprised of three individual exams and is designed to validate competency in three key areas: Computing Fundamentals, Living Online, and Key Applications. IC3 Global Standard 5 (GS5) is the newest addition to the IC3 Digital Literacy program. Like its predecessors, the GS5 certification is comprised of three exams: Computing Fundamentals, Living Online, and Key Applications.

IC3 GS4 Exam Objectives

Computing Fundamentals: What is an OS and what does it do? Manage computer files and folders; PC configuration, Control Panel, OS drivers; Common computer terminology; Types of Computers & Mobile devices; Computer performance; Installing/Uninstalling Software; Understanding SW licenses; Types of software applications & tools; Troubleshooting basic software problems; Troubleshooting basic hardware problems; Devices and Peripherals; Backup and Restore.

Key Applications: Common Application Features; Basic Text Formatting; Navigating Files and Folders; Working with multimedia files; Word processing activities and methods; Tables & Lists; Page Layout; Spreadsheet components; Worksheet Layout; Working with Data; Presentation activities; Inserting content; Slide Management; Slide Design; Basic Database Interactions; Record Managements; Collaboration; Sharing files.

Living Online: Internet, Browsers, and WWW; Navigation on the internet using a browser; Internet Connection; Network types and features, capabilities; Network connection troubleshooting; E-mail communication; Real-Time communication; Digital citizenship/ "Netiquette"; Communication standards; Legal and responsible use of computers; Secure online communication or activity; Ergonomics; Research fluency; Using Search Engines; Evaluate search results; Using advanced features of search engines.

Living Online: Internet Navigation (Usage, searching, browser functionality, common terms, licensing); Common Functionality (Websites, navigation, click types); Email Clients (Applications, etiquette, email management, attachments, contacts); Calendaring (Events, sharing, usage); Social Media (Digital identity, site types, cyber bullying); Communications (Tools, SMS, chat, distance); Online Conferencing; Streaming; Digital Principles/Ethics/Skills/Citizenship (Changes in tech, personal vs professional).

- 2) Are program concentrators (completed more than half the program 7 or more segments) and who will leave school at the end of the current school year.

Any student who wishes to achieve an industry recognized certification upon completion of the program.
