Assessment Name: IT Fundamentals

Assessment Description: The CompTIA IT Fundamentals exam covers foundational IT concepts including identifying and explaining computer components, installing software, establishing network connectivity, and preventing security risks. No prior experience is recommended or required to attempt this certification.

Content Areas Covered by the Assessment:

Identify and explain basic computer components; Set up a basic workstation; Conduct basic software installation; Establish basic network connectivity; Identify compatibility issues; Identify/prevent basic security risks; Understand safety and preventative maintenance of computers. These content examples are meant to clarify the test objectives and should not be construed as a comprehensive listing of all the content of this examination.

How many Questions are on the assessment? Is the assessment timed?

The CompTIA IT Fundamentals certification exam consists of 75 multiple-choice questions and is a timed test with a total administration time of one hour.

Who must take the assessment?

Students enrolled in the state-approved CTE programs listed above whom either:

- 1) Completed the program in the current school year (have completed all 12 segments) and earned at least a 2.0 in each course section.

-OR-

- 2) Are program concentrators (completed more than half the program – 7 or more segments) and who will leave school at the end of the current school year.

Any student who wishes to achieve an industry recognized certification upon completion of the program.

What is the procedure to order assessments?

Schools can only obtain **academic pricing** for CompTIA exams by registering the school's contact information at [CompTIA's website](http://www.comptia.org/academy) (www.comptia.org/academy). IT Fundamentals has a regular price of \$115 vs. an academic price of \$70.

The IT Fundamentals exam is available to order in two ways. Individual exams, or multi-exam packs of 50 or 100 exams. A lower price per exam is available for schools ordering multi-packs.

Academic Pricing:

Single exam	\$70	
50 exam pack	\$1,550	* Requires testing via the Anywhere Proctor system
100 exam pack	\$2,300	* Requires testing via the Anywhere Proctor system

Exams are valid for one year from date of purchase and may not be renewed.

Orders may be placed using CompTIA's online marketplace. Orders placed in this manner will be at full price, not the academic price. Below are account and order details to assist with implementation.

- Orders are through the CompTIA website
 - Create a username and password to establish an account
- Select the IT Fundamentals certification and add to cart
 - Select the number of test vouchers you wish to purchase
 - i. Test vouchers are good for 12 months
 - A credit card is required for purchase
- A confirmation email is sent after the order is placed
- Plan carefully. Test vouchers are good for 12 months, but are not eligible for return

How is the assessment administered?

If Fundamentals single exams may be delivered at a [Pearson VUE test center](http://www.pearsonvue.com) (www.vue.com).

For schools using multi pack exams, the exam **must** be delivered using the [Anywhere Proctor System](http://www.anywhereproctor.com). Anywhere Proctor allows exams to be delivered on almost any Windows based Internet-connected computer. What is the testing window?

The assessment dates are district-determined.

Orders for online assessments are processed in two business days if payment is rendered via credit card or for schools with a pre-approved line of credit. POs can take several weeks to clear.

The certification test is available in English, Japanese, Portuguese, Spanish, German, Korean, traditional Chinese, and simplified Chinese.

Score reports are printed at the testing site. Test candidates may also print a duplicate score report by accessing their online candidate profile at [Person Vue](#) (www.vue.com).

What is a passing score on the assessment?

The cut score for the IT Fundamentals certification is 650.
