- SUBJECT: Critical Shortage Lists for Employment of Retirees

Pursuant to <u>Michigan Compiled Law 38.1361</u>, the Michigan Department of Education has compiled the list of critical shortage areas for employment of retirees for the 2020-2021 academic year.

Academic Year 2020-2021 Critical Shortage Disciplines for Employment of Retirees

If a discipline is not listed as a shortage, and a retiree is needed to fill a vacancy, law stipulates a process by which districts may seek to have the discipline added. Districts must use the <u>Critical Shortage Request Form</u> and include required evidence to submit a request. This list, including district level additions, is maintained on the Office of Educator Excellence <u>Permits and Placement</u> webpage.
