- SUBJECT: Section 99K Cybersecurity Competition Event Grant Announcement

The Section 99k – Cybersecurity Competition Event Grant-Round Two is still available in the Michigan Electronic Grants System (MEGS+). The purpose of the grant is to provide pupils in grades 6-12 with expanded opportunities to improve computer science skills by participating in cybersecurity competitive events. The intent of the grant is to increase the number of pupils demonstrating proficiency in science and mathematics on the state assessment and to increase the number of pupils who are college- and career-ready upon high school graduation. This grant supports the Michigan Department of Education's (MDE's) Top 10 in 10 goals two, three, four, and six through several key activities.

This grant will fund teams that participate in cybersecurity events hosted by <u>Merit</u> <u>Network, Incorporated</u>, known as Michigan High School Cyber Challenge, and/or hosted by Air Force Association, known as <u>CyberPatriot</u> in the 2018-19 school year. The Governor's Michigan High School Cyber Challenge will be offered this fall. The CyberPatriot program team registration is now open for the 2018-19 competition. All public school districts and public school academies in Michigan are eligible to apply. Intermediate School Districts (ISDs) that enroll full-time students at the ISD are eligible to apply as well. A minimum of \$149,000 is available from the 2017-2018 State School Aid, P.A. 108.
