SUBJECT: Digital Learning Day – February 22, 2018 – Make Every Day Digital Learning Day

February 22 marks the seventh annual Digital Learning Day celebration across the United States and Michigan. This grassroots effort continues to celebrate the power of innovative practices happening in classrooms every day through the effective use of modern day tools. The Alliance for Excellent Education defines digital learning as, "any instructional practice that effectively uses technology to strengthen a student's learning experience. It emphasizes high-quality instruction and provides access to challenging content, feedback through formative assessment, opportunities for learning anytime and anywhere, and individualized instruction to ensure all students reach their full potential to succeed in college and a career."

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) and our collaborative partners are committed this year to spreading the word and supporting educators to make **Every Day Digital Learning Day** by highlighting several Education Technology Initiatives that support Michigan's Top 10 in 10 Strategic Plan.

Michigan Integrated Technology Competencies for Students (MITECS)

The MITECS, released December 2017, replace the 2009 Michigan Educational Technology Standards for Students (METS-S). These updated competencies focus on learning enhanced by technology rather than on technology tools. The MITECS are aligned to the Top 10 in 10 focus area of Learner-Centered Supports. They reflect a learner-driven approach that empowers students to be active participants in determining their educational pursuits. 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#GoOpen Michigan Initiative

In February of 2016, Michigan made a commitment to the United States Department of Education's #GoOpen Campaign creating the #GoOpen Michigan initiative. The initiative supports schools and educators in the transition to use high-quality digital, openly-licensed educational resources (OER). This initiative aligns to all four focus areas of Michigan's Top 10 in 10 strategic plan. The MDE is working collaboratively with a wide range of stakeholders to build a Michigan specific repository of curated and vetted OERs and design high-quality, easily accessible professional learning opportunities.
