For your planning purposes, the attached chart shows your estimated allocation for the Transition Coordination grant for FY 2011-2012. Estimated allocations are based on preliminary information we received from the United States Department of Education (USED) and student count data (please refer to the attached chart for calculation methodology). There is an increase in your award this fiscal year to support the Transition Coordinator position. Allowable expenditures are detailed in the Michigan Electronic Grants System (MEGS) application for this award.

You will receive a formal Grant Award Notification from Superintendent Michael Flanagan, pending receipt of the federal grant award from the USED and final approval. Please note that your estimated amount could change based on the final grant award received from the USED.
