SUBJECT: Individuals with Disabilities Education Act Public Reporting of Data

The federal regulations implementing the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act* (IDEA) at §300.602(b)(1)(i)(A) require public reporting on the performance of each local education agency on the targets established in the State Performance Plan (SPP) for each of the priority areas [Part B (3-21 year olds)] in Michigan.

The SPP for Part B of the IDEA 2004 (3-21 year olds) is comprised of 19 results and compliance indicators. The United States Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs, requires that each state report district level data. The 2014 Public Reporting data are from the 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 school years. The Part B indicators predominantly reflect data your district submitted to the state and will be included in the April 15 Continuous Improvement and Monitoring System electronic workbooks. For Part B, Indicators 1-14 are being publicly reported in Michigan's eighth year of public reporting:

- Indicator 1 - Graduation
- Indicator 2 - Dropout
- Indicator 3 - Statewide Assessment
- Indicator 4A - Suspension/Expulsion
- Indicator 4B - Suspension/Expulsion by Race/Ethnicity
- Indicator 5 - Educational Environments (least restrictive environment)
- Indicator 6 - Early Childhood Educational Environments: Ages 3-5
- Indicator 7 - Preschool Outcomes
- Indicator 8 - Facilitated Parent Involvement
- Indicator 9 - Disproportionate Representation (Child with a Disability)
- Indicator 10 - Disproportionate Representation (Eligibility Categories)

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Indicator 11 - Child Find
Indicator 12 - Early Childhood Transition
Indicator 13 – Secondary Transition
Indicator 14 – Postsecondary Outcomes

For a two-week period beginning approximately May 13, 2014, local educational agencies, public school academies, and intermediate school districts will be able to preview district level data for children and students ages 3 through 21.

By June 1, 2014, the district level data will be available to the public on the Michigan Department of Education web site. Links to the web site will be provided to state listservs by that date. In addition, district level data will be available at: www.mischooldata.org.

Interested individuals without internet access will be directed to the Center for Educational Networking for paper copies of district data. They may also contact their local or intermediate school district for this information.
