SUBJECT: Individuals with Disabilities Education Act Public Reporting of Data

The federal regulations implementing the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act* (IDEA) at §300.602(b)(1)(i)(A) require public reporting on the performance of each local education agency on the targets established in the State Performance Plan (SPP) for each of the priority areas. The IDEA requires two plans: Part B (3-21 year olds) and Part C (Birth through age 2), *Early On*® in Michigan.

The Part B and C indicators predominantly reflect data your district submitted to the state and will be included in the April 15 Continuous Improvement and Monitoring System electronic workbooks. Further information about the Part B indicators will be available at: [www.cenmi.org](http://www.cenmi.org) in the *Special Education Facts*.

The SPP for Part B is comprised of 20 results and compliance indicators. During the sixth year of public reporting, the United States Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs requires that each state report district level data. These data are from the 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 school years. For Part B of the IDEA 2004 (3-21 year olds) Indicators 1-5 and 7-14 are being publicly reported:

- Indicator 1 Graduation
- Indicator 2 Dropout
- Indicator 3 Statewide Assessment
- Indicator 4A Suspension/Expulsion
- Indicator 4B Suspension/Expulsion by Race/Ethnicity
- Indicator 5 Educational Environments (least restrictive environment)
- Indicator 7 Preschool Outcomes

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Indicator 8	Facilitated Parent Involvement
Indicator 9	Disproportionate Representation (Child with a Disability)
Indicator 10	Disproportionate Representation (Eligibility Categories)
Indicator 11	Child Find
Indicator 12	Early Childhood Transition
Indicator 13	Secondary Transition
Indicator 14	Postsecondary Outcomes

For a two week period beginning approximately May 14, 2012, local educational agencies, public school academies, and intermediate school districts will be able to preview district level data for children and students ages 3 through 21.

By June 1, 2012, the district level data will be available to the public on the Michigan Department of Education Web site. Link to the website will be provided to state listservs by that date. In addition, district level data will be available at: [www.mischooldata.org](http://www.mischooldata.org).

For Part C the data are reported on the performance of each Service Area. These data regarding infants and toddlers birth through age 2 will be available for a two week preview period beginning approximately May 14, 2012, and data will be released to the public by June 1, 2012. Eight of the 14 Part C indicators will be publicly reported for *Early On*<sup>®</sup>:
