SUBJECT: Immunization Requirements for Children Entering Kindergarten, 7th grade,

or Children Entering a New School District in grades 1-12 during the

2018-19 School Year

On August 23, 2018, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) and the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) issued guidance on a procedure for reporting student immunization status and immunization information, with and without personally identifiable information, in accordance with the Michigan Public Health Code, administrative rules, and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), 20 U.S.C. §1232g. The guidance document included MCIR SIRS (Michigan Care Improvement Registry School Immunization Reporting System) screenshots and an explanation on the "FERPA no consent" checkbox function.

On September 12th, you may have received an e-mail from a group called Michigan for Vaccine Choice (MVC), expressing its views on schools' immunization reporting obligations and FERPA. However, MDHHS and MDE's guidance on these matters remains unchanged. Contrary to MVC's claims, the guidance provides a reporting procedure in accordance with state and federal law.
