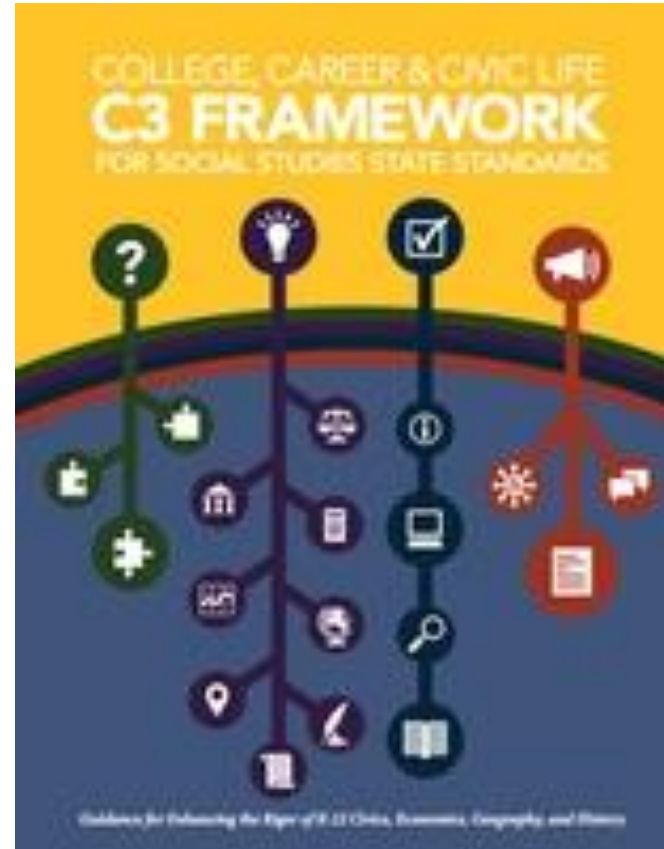

- Collaboration among peers
- EPI cross-university collaboration
- EPI collaboration to develop models and examples for pre-service teachers
- Changes in expectations for pre-service teachers
 - Application of C3 Framework
