Michigan Coordinated Eligibility and Enrollment Project

The Michigan Office of Great Start (OGS) is seeking to build local capacity to implement community-based coordinated eligibility and enrollment systems

Coordinated eligibility and enrollment (CEE) is a systems-building approach that aims to address the current fragmented nature of early learning and family support systems to ensure that all young children and their families can benefit from the full range of services and supports available to them. CEE systems have several important goals:

- o Better meet the needs of children and families
- o Help ensure equitable access to programs and services
- o Allocate limited resources more efficiently
- o Promote effective service delivery

OGS has partnered with School Readiness Consulting (SRC) to implement a project focused on supporting local communities in building and enhancing systems to coordinate eligibility and enrollment. Taking a community-based approach to this work will accomplish many of the goals set by the state to more effectively include family voice and choice, deliver child and family services that are highly contextualized, and strengthen partnerships and coordination locally across programs and services. This project is supported by Preschool Development Grant Birth-Five (PDG B-5) resources awarded to Michigan in 2019 and renewed for 2020–2022. The project consists of a series of activities to support CEE efforts across the state.

About the **Toolkit**

What

The Coordinated Eligibility and Enrollment Toolkit is being created to assist communities in developing plans for implementing approaches to CEE. It is designed to answer the question: What should my community focus on in implementing Coordinated Eligibility and Enrollment, and how should we do it? The toolkit walks communities through steps from getting started to assessing needs and gaps, gathering input and information from families and other stakeholders, and finally developing a CEE implementation plan and designing a set of strategies and solutions. It is intended to be a "hands-on" guide for implementing CEE in local communities.

About the Community of Practice

What

OGS is selecting a cohort of 8 community teams to participate in a Coordinated Eligibility and Enrollment Community of Practice. Community teams will have the opportunity to learn together from other members of the cohort as well as refine their own local efforts and approaches. As part of the Community of Practice communities will:

 Come together for 10 virtual learning sessions to explore the key components and guiding principles for implementing an effective CEE process

o Develop a plan to continue working on CEE activities in your community

 Receive financial support to implement locally developed strategies aligned with one or more of the CEE key components

o Receive monthly newsletters containing resources and information to support the work

o Engage in one-on-one support with an assigned Technical Assistance provider

Strategies, tools, and lessons learned from communities will be shared broadly and disseminated through OGS to other communities across the state.

Who

This opportunity is for 8 Community-Based Implementation Teams (made up of diverse community and early learning partners) of the birth-5 early learning community at various stages of implementation, from piloting a new strategy to refining an ongoing strategy, who are ready to support CEE activities within one or more of the following areas:

- o Building family awareness of resources and services
- o Helping families select available resources and services
- o Ensuring families receive resources and services
- o Keeping families connected and supported
- o Advancing CEE infrastructure
