Supports & Accommodations Framework

- All tools are categorized into 1 of 3 groups
- Definitions of these categories vary by assessment

M-STEP Categories

Universal Tools

Available to all students - use is primarily student driven

Designated Supports

Available to students who have a specific need - use is primarily educator driven

Accommodations

Available to students with disabilities whose need for that specific accommodation is documented in IEP/504 plan



Frequent Areas of Confusion

- Students with IEPs can't use Universal Tools or Designated Supports. False
- Students with IEPs can use a Universal Tool or Designated Support if it's not identified in their IEP.
- Only English Learners can use Designated Supports. False
- Students who receive extra classroom support for reading can use Designated Supports if appropriate for their needs. True



As you prepare for testing, create processes for the following:

- Review which tools students are using in the classroom
 - Have a meeting
 - Create a shared document to track tools needed for assessments
- Ensure there's a match between what is used in the classroom and what will be used on the state test
- Review the Supports & Accommodations Guidance Document
- Identify staff responsible for inputting Designated Supports or Accommodations into the online testing systems
- Identify staff who will serve as human readers, translators, or scribes
 They must review and use the appropriate guidelines in the Supports & Accommodations Guidance Document.



Consider students' individual needs.

- Do not enable or provide a Designated Support or Accommodation to all students in a grade level, building, or district.
- Providing students with more than they need/know how to use effectively can negatively impact their scores
- Not providing students with what they need can negatively impact their scores





- Does the student have a disability impacting their vision?
- Does the student have a disability impacting their hearing?
- Does the student require an audio presentation of text?
- Is the student identified as an English Learner?
- Does the student need help maintaining concentration?

- Does the student require an audio presentation of the text?
 - Review the Text-to-Speech and Read-Aloud Decision Guidance in the <u>Supports & Accommodations Guidance Document</u>



- Is the student identified as an English Learner?
 - M-STEP Guide for Teachers of Students who are English Learners



- Does the student need help maintaining concentration?
 - Masking (DS)
 - Additional Time (allowable administration option)
 - One-on-one or purposeful small group administration (UT)

Text-to-Speech

There are two types of Text-to-Speech available for M-STEP - the availability of each differs by content area and grade.

- 1. Designated Support Text-to-Speech
- 2. Accommodation Text-to-Speech Passage



Text-to-Speech

- Designated Support Text-to-Speech
 - Available for ELA, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies
 - Reads questions and answer options for students
 - There are no reading passages on the Mathematics, Science, or Social Studies assessments
- 2. Accommodation Text-to-Speech Passage
 - Available for ELA grades 6 & 7 only



New for M-STEP 2021 – for Science & Social Studies

- Continuous Magnification holds magnification between screens
- TTS for Directions Only is available
- COVID Considerations
 - Use what the student is most comfortable with/has been using during instruction this year
