News to Know

MiMTSS Fiscal Guidance Document

MDE has developed and released the <u>Fiscal Guidance for Implementing</u> an <u>MTSS</u>. The document provides Michigan school districts with guidance on how to coordinate the use of state and federal funds to support MTSS implementation. The guidance begins with a brief overview of MTSS as defined by the MDE MTSS Practice Profile and general methods for coordinating state and federal funds. The overview is followed by descriptions of how federal and state funds may be used to implement example activities organized first by funding streams and then by the five essential components of MTSS. Lastly, three narratives showcase diverse districts applying the continuous-improvement process to identify needs, develop plans, and fund activities to support MTSS implementation. Each district narrative offers unique insights into how districts are implementing MTSS and illustrates how coordinated funds may be used to improve learner outcomes. Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) Children matter. You matter. Learn SEL!

There is still time to help you help your students! Last spring, MDE launched the **Children matter. You matter. Learn SEL!** campaign. MDE now is asking leaders and educators to complete an 'Introduction to SEL' online module hosted through Michigan Virtual. The goal is for as many educators as possible (a minimum of one school leader and two to four teachers per building across the state) to complete the module. The course is free, offers State continuing Education Clock Hours (SCECHs), and is open to all districts.

MiMTSS TA Center Professional Learning Opportunities

The MiMTSS TA Center also is currently surveying stakeholders to determine the best times to offer universal professional learning during the school day or after school. The dates and times will be forthcoming and advertised under the "upcoming events" on the <u>MiMTSS TA Center website</u>, and emailed via the MiMTSS TA Center listserv. MiMTSS Data System

The <u>MiMTSS Data System</u> is a free-access, web-based information system designed for Local Education Agencies (LEAs), ISDs, and MDE to gather and analyze data critical for the continuous improvement of MTSS in Michigan. Users can enter capacity assessment data, MTSS fidelity data, and student outcome indicators. Teams can monitor the impact of MTSS implementation on reading and behavior outcomes using dashboards. Thirty-two ISDs, 184 districts, and 39 public school academies already are using the MiMTSS Data System.

MTSS Resources & Supports for MICIP

The MiMTSS Technical Assistance Center has a number of resources available to MICIP users that have also been included in the MICIP Process Guide. These resources might be helpful to all districts regardless of partnership with the MiMTSS TA Center. If you have districts that are engaged or considering engaging in MTSS work and/or partnering with the MiMTSS TA Center, you may be interested to know that the MIMTSS TA Center has been working to align with MICIP, including creating resources that will help avoid duplication of efforts. One such example is a new reporting feature within the MiMTSS Data System, allowing districts to download reports specific to MICIP, including a Behavior Data Set (PBIS), a Reading and Engagement Data Set, and a District Capacity Data Set. The reports pull several MTSS data graphs and tables from the MiMTSS Data System into a single file that can be exported as a PDF and then uploaded into the MICIP Platform as data objects in the Whole Child Data Discovery section. Additional resources are also available on the MTSS Supports for MICIP pages on the MiMTSS TA Center website.

MiMTSS State Conference

On August 3 - 4, the MiMTSS TA Center held its 16th annual state conference. The conference focused on advancing effective MTSS implementation to ensure the growth and success of all learners. The two-day conference was an opportunity to learn the latest in research and best practices related to MTSS, strengthen implementation within your context, and connect and share with other attendees.
