

# New District Provided Professional Development Reporting Process for Educators

To alleviate the reporting of inaccurate information, eliminate the individual educator entry and paper process, and to streamline educator certificate renewals, the process for entering District Provided Professional Development (DPPD) has been changed. Beginning July 1, 2020, districts are required to enter all DPPD to be used for educator recertification as State Continuing Education Credit Hours (SCECHs) into the Michigan Online Educator Certification System (MOECS).

## What this means for educators:

- Educators will no longer be able to enter DPPD that takes place after June 30, 2020 into MOECS.
- Any DPPD accrued after June 30 will need to be entered by the district as SCECHs. After the SCECH Coordinator uploads attendance from a SCECH program, each participant will receive an automatically generated program evaluation survey. Once completed, the educator will receive the SCECH credit for the DPPD program.
- Past DPPD entered into the MOECS logs may still be used by educators for recertification during their next renewal.
- Educators will be allowed to continue to submit DPPD that occurs prior to July 1, 2020 into MOECS
- For any DPPD already entered into MOECS, educators must keep proof of participation in the program, including agendas. For any DPPD after July 1, 2020, educators will no longer be required to keep documentation as districts must have that information.
- Any DPPD accrued prior to July 1, 2020 that is entered into the DPPD Log in MOECS must be printed out and approved by the district.
