SUBJECT: Estimated Awards for the Enhancing Opportunities for Students with Disabilities (EOSD), and Transition Services and Transition Coordinator Grant for FY 2009-2010

For your planning purposes, the attached charts show your estimated awards for the EOSD and Transition Services and Transition Coordinator Grant for FY 2009-2010. Estimated awards are based on preliminary information we received from the United States Department of Education (USED) and 2008 count data (please refer to the attached charts for calculation methodology). Last fiscal year, the Transition Services award was reduced by 35 percent. The award will remain the same for fiscal year 2009-2010 and then eliminated in fiscal year 2010-2011. The Transition Coordinator award is anticipated to remain the same.

You will receive a formal Grant Award Notification from Superintendent Michael Flanagan, pending receipt of the federal grant award from USED and final approval of the grants. Please note that your estimated amount could change based on the final grant award received from the USED.

The application for EOSD is available and ready for you to complete in the Michigan Electronic Grants System (MEGS), as of April 1, 2009. The application for Transition Services should be available tentatively by May 4, 2009.

Six divisions of ISDs are established according to the December 2008 student count of 3-21 year olds. The grant award is based on \$45,000 with increments of \$5,000. The three state agencies are allocated \$30,000 each.
