SUBJECT: Special Education Public Reporting of District Data

The federal regulations implementing the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) at §300.602(b)(1)(i)(A) require public reporting on the performance of each local education agency on the targets established in the State Performance Plan (SPP) for each of the priority areas. The IDEA requires two plans: Part B (3-21 year olds) and Part C (Birth through age 2), *Early On*[®] in Michigan.

The Part B and C Indicators predominantly reflect data your district submitted to the state and were included in the April 15 Continuous Improvement and Monitoring Process (CIMS-2) electronic workbook. Further information about these Indicators will be available at: www.cenmi.org in the Special Education Facts documents.

The SPP for Part B is comprised of 20 results and compliance indicators. During the fourth year of public reporting, the United States Department of Education (USDOED) Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) requires that each state report district level data. These data are from the 2007-2008 and 2008-2009 school years. For Part B of the IDEA 2004 (3-21 year olds) Indicators 1-5 and 8-12 are being publicly reported:

1. Graduation
2. Dropout
3. Statewide Assessment
4. Suspension/Expulsion
5. Educational Environments (least restrictive environment)
8. Facilitated Parent Involvement
9. Disproportionate Representation (Child with a Disability)
10. Disproportionate Representation (Eligibility Categories)
11. Child Find
12. Early Childhood Transition

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For a two week period beginning approximately May 18, 2010, local educational agencies, public school academies, and intermediate school districts will be able to preview district level data for students ages 3 through 21.

By June 1, 2010, the district level data will be available to the public on the Michigan Department of Education Web site. Links to the Web site will be provided to state listservs by that date.

For Part C the data are reported on the performance of each Service Area. These data regarding infants and toddlers birth through age 2 will be available for a two week preview period beginning approximately May 18, 2010, and data will be released to the public by June 1, 2010. Seven of the 14 Part C indicators will be publicly reported for *Early On*[®]:

1. Timely Service Delivery
2. Settings
4. Family Outcomes
5. Child Find, Ages Birth -1
6. Child Find, Ages Birth -3
7. Timeliness of Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP)
8. Early Childhood Transition
