SUBJECT: PSAT and SAT Fall 2020 Update – MEMO #COVID-19-113

Governor Gretchen Whitmer's Executive Order 2020-65, issued April 30, 2020, requires districts to administer the PSAT and the SAT in the fall of 2020. The order specified that these assessments should be taken in the fall by high school students who were not able to take them in the spring of 2020 due to the cancellation of state assessments because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since the issuance of E.O. 2020-65, the Michigan Department of Education has worked closely with the governor's office and the legislature to create language that is intended to clarify this requirement. This language appears in Section 104g, MCL 388.1704g of the State School Aid Act, passed by the legislature on September 23, 2020.

The law requires districts to make the PSAT and SAT tests available to eligible students this fall and to encourage, but not require, students to take the assessments.
