SUBJECT: Retirement of the *Legacy* Michigan Electronic Grants System and Child

**Nutrition Application Program Systems** 

For more than a decade the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) has used the Michigan Electronic Grants System (MEGS) and Child Nutrition Application Program (CNAP) on-line electronic systems for collecting education grant and school nutrition application and reporting information. In April 2011 the MDE launched the Michigan Electronic Grant System *Plus* (MEGS+) and began transitioning all MEGS and CNAP applications to a new, single, electronic reporting system.

Since these legacy systems are no longer used for submitting and approving applications and reports, the MDE will be retiring both systems effective March 31, 2015. After March 31, 2015, the Legacy systems will no longer be accessible by agencies and MDE will maintain read-only copies of the Legacy systems on the Department's intranet. The Department will continue to hold the database copies on the Department's intranet until all of the document retention requirements are satisfied.

If an agency should require a copy of an application to satisfy any of its audits after March 31, 2015, they should contact the MDE program office responsible for managing the application or report.
