- **SUBJECT:** Seclusion and Restraint Data Reporting and Analysis Requirements

State law (<u>MCL 380.1307f</u>) requires that seclusion and restraint for all students must be reported in the Michigan student data system (MSDS) this year, regardless of the mode of instruction being provided to students during a pandemic.

The <u>seclusion and restraint component</u> in MSDS is used to collect data related to the use of emergency restraint and seclusion in a school district, public school academy (PSA) or intermediate school district (ISD) program. The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) will make available redacted, aggregate data on the reported use of seclusion and restraint, compiled by school districts, PSAs, and ISDs. Districts are required to use proactive, effective, evidence- and research-based strategies to reduce the occurrence of challenging behaviors; to eliminate the use of seclusion and restraint, except in the case of emergencies noted in the law; and to increase meaningful instructional time for all pupils. <u>Michigan's MTSS Technical</u> <u>Assistance Center</u> (MiMTSS) is a free support to districts and partners to implement and sustain school-wide behavior and reading systems of support through intensive training and technical assistance.
