- SUBJECT: Career and Technical Education Student Incentive Payment

The State Legislature allocated \$5,000,000 in the <u>State School Aid Act, P.A. 94 of</u> <u>1979, as amended, Section 61d</u>, as incentive for districts to enroll students in state-approved Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs. The purpose of these funds is to increase the number of students with high-quality degrees or credentials, and to increase the number of students who are college and career ready upon high school graduation.

Payments of \$25.00 per student in grades 9-12 will be distributed to districts whose students were enrolled in a state-approved CTE program. Districts with students enrolled in a high-demand, state-approved CTE program will receive an additional \$25.00 per student. High-demand, state-approved CTE programs include those in the following Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) Codes:

Funds will be distributed to the district in which the student was counted in membership in 2018-2019. The Section 61d funding will be estimated based on 2017-2018 CTE enrollments and adjusted in 2019-2020, based on actual 2018-2019 enrollments. Payments will be spread evenly across the 2018-2019 state school aid payment schedule.
